CURRENT PROJECTS

Reassessing Homesteading Project:

This project, under the overall direction of Professor Richard Edwards, seeks to reassess both the scholarly consensus and popular perceptions of the Homestead Act of 1862. The project uses previously unavailable data as well as new analysis techniques to challenge prevailing understandings.

Since May 2013, I have been a principal on the research team; I manage a digital component called *Homestead Nebraska*, (<http://segonku.unl.edu/~rwingo>). The team is preparing a book manuscript (publisher TBA); Dr. Elizabeth Jameson, University of Calgary and Western History Association President (2014-2015), will be reviewing the project.
